Who we are: GOTBA Vic is a volunteer association that represents greyhound owners, trainers, breeders and other participants in all areas of the sport in Victoria.

Participant costs survey 2019

- who responded and what did we ask?

- More than 100 survey responses online by Victorian greyhound racing participants split evenly across participation size and role
- Content -
 - current costs of keeping greyhounds in (1) rearing/breeding and (2) training
 - costs change since 2017
 - future participation in the sport of greyhound racing in Victoria





What the survey results say: a summary

- Average weekly keeping cost is between \$70-\$80 pw.
- ▶ A third of respondents say average keeping costs exceed \$90 per week per dog.
- ► Keeping costs for most up at least 15-30% since 2017: a combination of increases in feeding, utilities and admin/compliance costs.
- Returns have fallen well behind cost increases.
- More than 50% of respondents plan to participate <u>less</u> on and from 2020 due to costs, rules and regulations and the the *Code of Practice for the Keeping of Racing Greyhounds* commencing 1 Jan 2020.

What these results mean

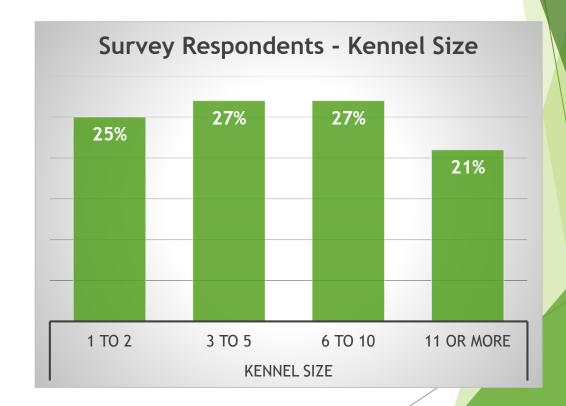
Costs and diminished return to participants are a serious risk to ongoing participation in greyhound racing in Victoria.

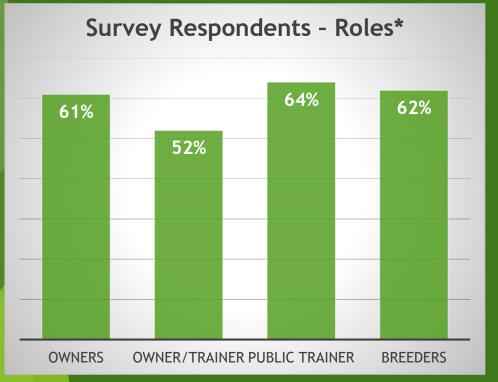




The Survey - who responded

Survey responses right across kennel sizes and participant roles

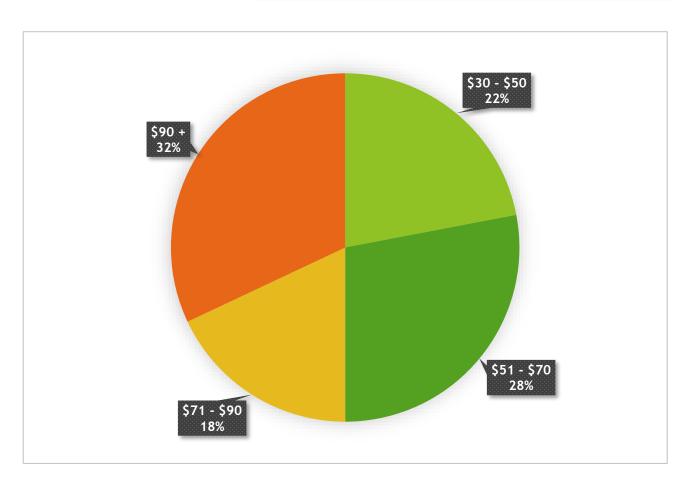




^{*} Respondents may have multiple roles.



Survey - Weekly keeping cost per greyhound being reared or bred - current



Analysis

- Cost includes food, transport, staff, utilities, costed admin tasks etc.
- Average cost

 (approx.): At least \$72
 p/w per greyhound,
 but appreciably more for a third of respondents



Survey - Weekly keeping cost per greyhound in training - current



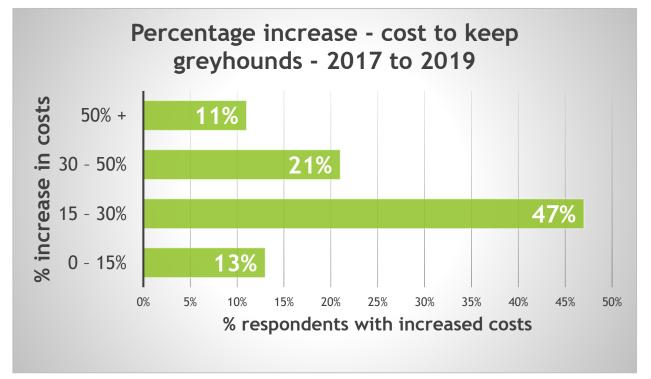
Analysis

- Cost includes food, transport, staff, utilities, costed admin tasks etc.
- Average weekly cost (approx.): At least \$76 p/w, but appreciably more for almost 40% of respondents



Survey - Change in costs - 2017 to 2019

- 94% say keeping greyhounds 'more expensive' or 'much more expensive' than in 2017.
- Asked to quantify change: the response



Analysis

- Most participants say increase of 15%-30% since 2017
- Comments refer to significant increase in feed cost (eg kangaroo) and rule compliance costs



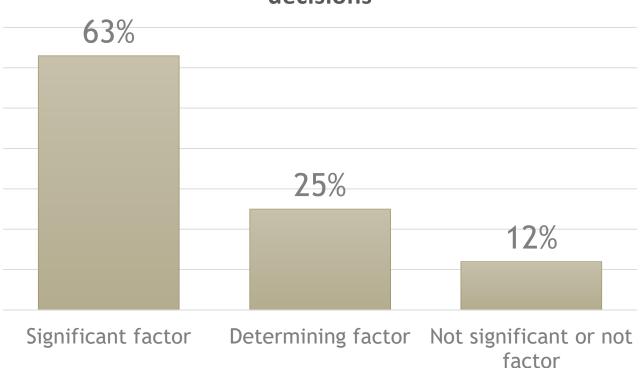
^{*} NOTE: Not all respondents who answered 'more expensive' then gave a % increase. Accordingly, % total less than 100%.

Conclusion: Returns to participants fall behind increasing costs

- ▶ Returns fall as % of GRV revenue: In 2013/14, GRV returned 56.4% of its wagering income to participants (as prizemoney, bonuses, starter fees). In 2017/18: 47.3%.
- Participants now work harder for less: In 2017/18 GRV returned less per race meeting held \$37,804 than it did in 2013/14 \$39,029.
- Prizemoney changes well below cost and additional work: Between 2015/16 and 2017/18, participant returns increased by 2.96% (\$43.8m to \$45.1m), despite approx. 5% more race meetings being held in 2017/18 (1193) than 2015/16 (1141).
- Summary: Return to participants have fallen well behind increasing cost and workload. Compliance and other costs continue to increase.

Survey - Impact of cost pressures on future participation





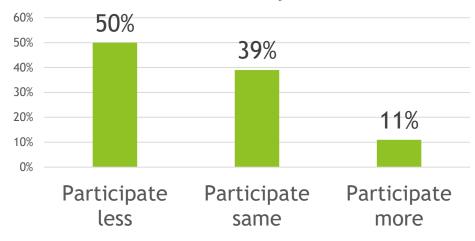
Analysis

• **88%** of participants say cost is a significant or determining factor in ongoing participation

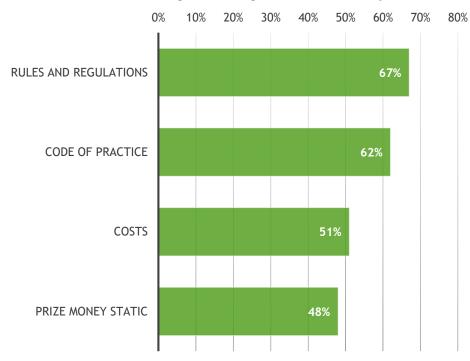


Survey - Participation intentions: 2020 and beyond
